



Asking For A Friend: Week 2

Start Talking:

- What is one of your greatest talents? How have you used this talent to honor God?

Start Sharing: Can God really use me to do something significant? How would you answer this question?

Read Exodus 4:10-12, 1 Samuel 16:6-7, Luke 22:60-62, and Matthew 14:28-29.

These passages explain the types of people God uses.

- What types of insecurities do you struggle with most?
- How have your insecurities hindered God from using you?
- In what ways do you see yourself as being too unlikely to be used by God?
- Who are some unlikely people you've seen God use in big ways? What can you learn from the way God has used them?
- How do you think God could use your brokenness to affect others in a positive way?
- What steps will you take towards discovering and responding to what God wants to do through you?

Start Doing:

- Check out the Brevard Community Church Library Titled “Asking For A Friend” on Right Now Media App. (Click in the upper left corner once you've opened the app, and click on “Brevard Community Church”)
- Do an imperfection audit. List your imperfections and ask God to develop you. Create a spiritual growth plan that will move you into a more dynamic relationship with Jesus Christ.

Start Praying: God, thank You for the gifts and talents that You've given me. Help me to embrace Your purpose for my life and to have confidence in the gifts that You've given me to use for Your glory. I pray that I would have confidence in my identity in You alone, and that with Your strength, I will be able to fight off the lies that the enemy tries to plant in my mind that I can't be used in a significant way to serve You.
